During the month of June, Sector 312, experienced an increase in **Robbery**, there were ten reported offenses. Five of these were from individuals, of which two arrests have been made. Four other robberies were from commercial businesses and one Robbery - Carjacking.

We also recorded increases in **Burglary (20)** and **Theft From Motor Vehicle (21)**, the majority of these offenses occurred in apartment complexes. More details of these offenses are contained within this newsletter.

In this challenging economic environment we are seeing an increase in the aforementioned offenses. Many criminals are becoming very bold and opportunistic. It is imperative that we work together to ensure that your homes and vehicles are as secure as possible, reporting suspicious persons to police, paying careful attention to your surroundings and "lighting up" your neighborhoods are just some of the ways to reduce criminal activity.

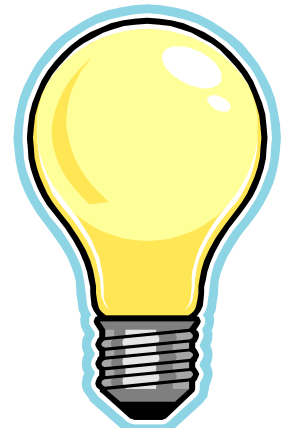

### Citizen Complaint - 615 W. 19th St.

On the night of June 30, in response to community complaints at 615 W. 19th St., **Officer David Hoath**, **MPO Roger Yutzey** and **Sgt. David Galyon** responded to this address. These officers demonstrated excellent investigative skill and tactical ability during their encounter with the residents. One individual was arrested for an outstanding Felony - Probation Violation Warrant, another male attempted to flee out of a rear door and was quickly apprehended, this individual was found to be in possession of over (80) grams of suspected marijuana and was charged with PWID Marijuana, a third person was also arrested for Public Drunkenness.

- Put your office address on luggage tags to prevent anyone from getting your home address while you're travelling.
